Create an evacuation plan so you are ready Here are some tips...

- 1) Be prepared to stay or go
- 2) Have more than one way out of each room
- 3) Take your disaster kit with you
- 4) Remember the three "P's"- people, pets and pills
- 5) Have an outside neighborhood meeting place
- 6) Have a place to go outside the community. For example, an out of town relative's house

Think about it...

- -Drive your planned evacuation route and plot alternate routes on a map in case of blocked roads or gridlock
- -Conduct fire drills and practice evacuating your home twice a year
- -If you are at home during a fire, go to your previously designated outside meeting place and stay there. Never go back into a burning building

Continue putting together your disaster kit:

This month you should get...

- 1) At least a three day supply of non-perishable food (ex: ready to eat canned meats, fruits, and vegetables)
- 2) A battery powered radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with tone alert, and extra batteries.
- 3) A flashlight with extra batteries.

Why? A large scale emergency situation may cause a loss of power to homes and businesses for an extended period of time also making fresh food unavailable. In addition, your battery-powered radio will help you get information from authorties about what to do.
