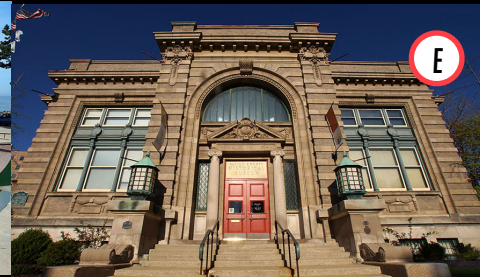

1525 Howe Street, Racine  
The radically designed Theater was part of the 1964 World's Fair, and still screens movies. The adjacent 14 story glass Research Tower opened in 1950, designed by visionary architect Frank Lloyd Wright. Group guided tours begin at the Rondelle and cover the Rondelle, Research Tower, and Wingspread.
