
Zoning - How to check it yourself


- Go to website https://www.buildupracine.org/business-tools/planning/
- On the map type an address into "Find Address or Place".




- Go to layers, turn on visibility for "Planning and Zoning Information".



Click the drop-down arrow.




- Turn on visibility for "Zone Districts".



- Click the tab "Legend" on the top right.



- Scroll down on the legend to match the zoning district color to the zone.



Once you know the zoning district you can check what uses are allowed in the Municipal Code of the city of Racine.

- Go to https://library.municode.com/wi/racine/codes/code of ordinances
- Click "Search or jump to" and type in your zoning code.

Look for a chapter title that matches your zoning code



 Look for your intended use of your property within the "permitted uses and regulations sections".

Sec. 114-507. - Permitted uses and regulations.

Notes:

- Some of the descriptions use language not commonly used in conversation today. If your use is not exactly listed here it might qualify for a similar category. (For example: "Automobile Service Stations" are gas stations).
- Some zones that are listed with higher numbers include permitted uses in lower numbers if you see the description "Any use permitted in the [B2] district shall be permitted in the [B4] district". If you don't see your desired use search for this district as well.
- (b) Permitted uses. Any use permitted in the B2 district shall be permitted in the B4 district, and in addition, the following uses shall be permitted:

- If you do not see your desired use listed here it may be located under permitted "conditional uses".
- Sec. 114-508. Conditional uses.
- If your desired use is under a conditional use, then you will have to apply for a conditional use permit.
